



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Phase Three – Proposed Changes Bank St. School

- The current Oaklands Elementary boundary would be reduced. The former portion is proposed to become the Bank St. School catchment.
- The catchment area that was described as Victor would become the Bank St. catchment, expanding into the Willows catchment and part of the current Oaklands catchment. This will reduce enrolmeboressu2treschrae

Phase Three – Proposed Changes Bank St. School

• Willows catchment would increase in the north but reduced in the southern portion. The Lansdowne slope would become a part of the Willows boundary.


Bank St. – Proposed Pathways
